## CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

A lot has happened since the last Village Update, I shall concentrate on four important items. Firstly, Sue Bassett, our Parish Clerk of 16 years, has expressed a desire to reduce her hours. Sue has made a major contribution to the work of the Parish Council and to the wellbeing of our community. However, I am delighted to say that we are not totally losing her as she will be taking up a new position as the Responsible Finance Officer. This is an official position which is responsible for the accounts and finances of the Council. In the meantime we shall be taking steps to recruit a new Clerk.

Secondly, you may have noticed two new security cameras in the village. One has been installed in the Parade and the other is currently in Market Street although it is our intention that the latter will be moved to Jubilee Field once the necessary planning permission has been obtained. These Stryker Polecat cameras are wholly owned by the Parish Council and are state of the art. They are linked to the Maidstone CCTV Monitoring Centre and as well as live pictures the images are recorded on to a hard-drive which has storage for up to one month. We have liaised closely with the Police and Maidstone Borough Council in selecting these cameras and their installation and I should like to take this opportunity to thank them both for the valuable advice and assistance they have given to us. These cameras have been partly funded through a grant from Kent County Council for which we are extremely grateful. We believe these cameras will help to ensure that our community remains safe and secure.

Thirdly, we continue to play a major role in supporting the parishes' position concerning the grant for concurrent functions. This grant is currently given by Maidstone Borough Council for services provided by the parishes which in the urban areas would be provided by Maidstone Borough Council itself. Maidstone Borough Council wish to move away from a grant based scheme which we are not against in principle. However, the current arrangement is both simple to operate and is easily understood and

we would not want to lose these advantages. We have successfully ensured that there will be no reduction in the grant for 2012/13. Nevertheless we recognise that Maidstone Borough Council is under severe financial constraint and that future arrangements will have to take this into account. It is our intention to continue to contribute to the ongoing discussions with Maidstone Borough Council.

Finally, the Council has recommended that the Precept for 2012/13, based on a Band D property, will increase from £35.13 per annum to £40.40 per annum. The increase not only takes into account the extra services provided such as the reopening of the public toilets and the street cleaning, but also the need to strengthen the Council's general reserve. I hasten to add that the Council's policy is not to hold high levels of general reserve. Nevertheless accounting prudence and audit requirements require us to meet certain levels. In reality this increase amounts to less than 10 pence per week. We continue to put a lot of effort into ensuring that our internal controls and our accounts are sound and these are regularly reviewed.

We are delighted to welcome Anne Gosling as the newly co-opted councillor and we look forward to working with her.


#### **Christmas Lights**

## MAIDSTONE BOROUGH COUNCIL CORE STRATEGY

The Core Strategy planning document sets the general direction of development in the borough from now until 2026. It deals with homes, jobs, shopping, leisure, environment, transport issues and provides the overall framework to guide development. Following the consultation process, MBC received 2,780 separate comments and are currently analysing these. MBC plan to hold a post-consultation conference on the 29th February 2012 and a Staplehurst delegate will be sent. Meanwhile the local Rural Settlement Group continues to monitor the situation whilst working on the draft Staplehurst Neighbourhood Plan which eventually will be subject to a Local Referendum. ## STAPLEHURST EMERGENCY HELP TEAM I

Since the successful Community Shelter/Rest Centre exercise that the Emergency Help Team reported on in the winter Update it has continued to welcome new members to the team. There is now a dedicated mobile phone which will be on and in the care of one of the members on a rota basis. It would be this mobile that starts the telephone tree alert in the case of an emergency. Hi Viz jackets will be purchased very soon on which it is hoped to have the logo printed.

Several of the SEHT members are going to undertake a First Aid course run by the Red Cross who are taking an active interest in the group because it is the first of its kind in the county to be accredited by KCC. Several more parishes are in the process of emulating its success and the Kent Association of Local Councils is to run a course on Emergency Planning for Parishes using SEHT as the example to follow. Some of the members will be participating in these courses by passing on some of their experiences.



In April there will be a joint fact finding visit with members of the Parish Council to Maidstone Fire Station to see some of the latest equipment, but also to find out how the new 'cluster' system works in rural areas. Your PC is forging close links with Kent Fire and Rescue Service in the same way that it does with the police.

There will be a meeting for all SEHT volunteers on Monday 12th March at 8pm in the South Hall of the Village Centre. All residents are welcome to come along and find out about the SEHT.
