# **Survey Process**

As part of the consultation process a survey was available from 11<sup>th</sup> September until 16<sup>th</sup> October 2023. The survey was promoted online, and a paper copy circulated to all residents via the parish newsletter. Postal entries were accepted up until 23<sup>rd</sup> October to allow for delays in the service.

The survey received 312 responses, 186 online and 126 hard copies entered manually, 38 were incomplete, in that the respondent answered some questions but did not finish the survey, in the majority of cases this is because they ended the survey before completing the equality and diversity section. The results will include questions that were completed.



The survey enabled people to give their views on the current facilities, to comment on the plans and outline if they would be interested in hiring the facility and what new activities, they would be interested in.


All individuals were encouraged to complete Equality & Diversity monitoring forms to show the range of people consulted.

# Views of Non regular users of Jubilee Field

The 3G working group asked for further analysis as to how those that stated they were not regular visitors to Jubilee Field voted regarding the key questions 8, 9 and 10.

In Question 2, 124 people stated they were not regular visitors to Jubilee field, 11 respondents did not answer these 3 questions, making a total of 113 respondents who answered as follows.

### **Question 8**

66% (75) stated they were not concerned about the loss of open space compared to 33% (38) who were concerned even though they are not regular users of the field.

#### Question 9

63% (71) were in agreement that £210,616.98 of S106 developer funding is spent on this project, compared to 37% (42)who were not.

#### Question 10

65% (74) agreed or strongly agreed with the Parish Councils proposal compared to 22% (25) who disagreed or strongly disagreed with it.
