CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The Parish Council's 21-year lease of Surrenden Field from Maidstone Borough Council expires at the end of March and we have been in lengthy negotiations (with the aid of Councillor Perry) about what will happen after that. At the time of writing we are reviewing a proposal for a 125-year lease at a peppercorn rent. We are also seeking to acquire a section of footpath KM312 (from the end of Bell Lane behind Bathurst Road) from the administrators of Carillion. Some work to improve drainage of this path was carried out by the Community Payback team last year. Following residents' concerns about speeding traffic, the Parish Council commissioned a professional survey of traffic on the A229. The data provides hard evidence which backs up the general impression that a small minority of drivers grossly exceed the speed limits. The traffic volumes measured will also give a baseline to assess the effects of housing development, not just in Staplehurst, but further south along the A229. Finally, we have received a number of complaints about the construction work in Marden Road. We have passed these on to the developer. Plus Maidstone Borough Council (who are primarily responsible for planning and environmental enforcement) also have the matter in hand. The Parish Council is now holding regular meetings with David Wilson Homes, both to pass on residents' concerns and also to understand their future plans for the site as a whole.


SUMMER PLAYSHEME

The Parish Council has again agreed to subsidise the summer playscheme, working with Play Place. The Council has worked with this company for many years and we were particularly pleased with their Ofsted rating of 'Good' last year, which was richly deserved. The Council hopes to use the Primary School facilities again. The dates are yet to be confirmed, but we anticipate a similar provision to last year. SPRING COMMUNITY CLEAN-UP 2019 – SATURDAY MARCH 23RD

PARISH COUNCIL FINANCES

The Staplehurst Parish Council component of your Council Tax will increase by 3% for the year 2019-2020, with the annual cost for a typical Band D property going up from £60.30 at present to £62.13 in the coming year. The budget for 2019-2020 forecasts a deficit of nearly £24,000 which will be funded from the Council's general and specific reserves. While these will still be at a safe level, and there is no point in collecting money from residents simply for it to sit in the Parish Council's bank

account, this is clearly not something that can be repeated too often. Detailed accounts for the current year will go to every house in Staplehurst as part of the Parish Council's Annual Report in May.



COULD YOU BE A PARISH COUNCILLOR?

The Parish Council's four-year term of office concludes this year. A new council will be elected on 2nd May 2019. If you are interested in Staplehurst and would like to put your skills and enthusiasm to good use, then please consider standing for election.

Any person eighteen years of age or older who is a local government elector, lives or works in the parish or lives within three miles of the parish boundary may stand for election to the new council. There are fifteen places on the council. If more than fifteen candidates stand, a contested election will be held. The election process is managed by Maidstone Borough Council. The election timetable states that it must publish a formal notice of election by 26th March. Candidates must deliver their nomination papers to MBC by 4.00pm on 3rd April.

There are many ways to find out more about what being a parish councillor involves: look for the posters displayed around the village and information leaflets which are available in the Parish Office, library and other selected outlets. Visit the Parish

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

The meeting will take place on Monday 25th March in the South Hall, Staplehurst Village Centre. The Parish Council hosts this public meeting to provide local electors with a forum for discussion of parish issues and to take reports from councillors and village groups. Please send written reports (500 words max.) and any issues for discussion to the Parish Office by 13th March. Reports will be included in meeting minutes for historical interest and published on the village website. Verbal reports and questions will be taken at the meeting if time permits.

SPEED WATCH IN JANUARY

The National Police Chief Council Week of Speed Action was held and Staplehurst's hardy volunteers stood out in the cold on three days, recording the details of 80 speeding vehicles which were entered into the Police database. 5 vehicles were driven at 45mph or more in the High Street or Station Road.

PLANNING UPDATE

Essential roadworks

I am sure many of you will have encountered the challenge that it has become recently to get out of Staplehurst to get to, well anywhere, by road. This has been due to a number of reasons from potholes and gas leaks to work on housing developments. We can only hope that soon they will all be complete - until the next round starts!

Please note that there is a three-week closure of Marden Road from 4th February between Clapper Lane and Oliver Road due to the Barratt David Wilson Homes Development. More details can be found at www.roadworks.org
