Vaccine Passport Phishing Email

It had to happen. I have been made aware of phishing emails being received impersonating the NHS, in order to apply for a digital vaccine passport. They ask you to click on a link, which takes you to a fake NHS website that asks for payment details. This is a SCAM.

Vaccination status is free and can be applied for via the NHS app or website. The below is the correct .GOV website. Just copy and paste this into your web browser to apply.

The Coronavirus Digital Passport is documentation proving that you have been vaccinated against COVID-19 or you recently recovered from COVID-19.

The passport will allow you to travel safely and freely around the world without having to self-isolate.

Who is eligible?

UK citizens and their families, and legal residents.

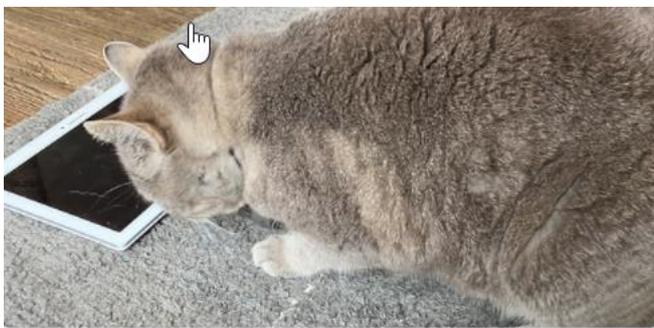
