STAPLE DRIVE PLAY AREA

Towards the end of last year the Parish Council approached Maidstone Borough Council to question the apparent abandonment of the Staple Drive Play area. Whilst the grass was maintained, the only remaining equipment was one set of four swings. MBC did not have a budget to cover all anticipated refurbishment costs, but it did offer matched funding of up to a maximum amount of £9000 if the Parish Council wanted to plan and manage the upgrade. A small group of councillors got together and through the next few months met representatives from three companies and drew up three options for upgrading the site.

These options were placed on a display board in the Library for a few weeks in February/March. A leaflet explaining the options was delivered to properties nearest to the play area.






A presentation was made to Staplehurst School Council. It was thought that the best opinions to seek were those of children, some of whom are now enjoying the refurbished site. As we have two other play areas in the village, the Parish Council considered it appropriate, given the residential surroundings, to make specific provision for younger children. Everyone had a vote who received a leaflet and saw the display and presentation. The majority of votes were for the scheme designed by Playdale. The Parish Council may be in a position to develop this site further if it is a success. Ideas should be given to the Parish Council office. There is currently no seating in this area, as supported by MBC, to dissuade people gathering there 'after hours'. This can be changed if seats are thought to be required. Our thanks go to MBC for matching funding and to Playdale for completing the work on schedule. The Chairman of SPC, with other councillors, welcomed our Mayor, Borough Councillor Eric Hotson, who with the School Council and other pupils of Staplehurst School and Mrs A. Bolt, Head Teacher, attended and completed the opening ceremony on 21st July. Please enjoy the area!

SPEED WATCH ALL-OUT DAY

Speed Watch All-Out day was in July. As in many

other parishes throughout Mid-Kent, volunteer teams were out from 7am until 1pm, in Staplehurst in the High Street opposite Cornforth Close. Four different team leaders and many of our volunteers manned our equipment on this day. We recorded 34 speeders in this 30mph zone, one at 46mph - the owner of this vehicle will be getting a letter from the police. The police of rural Maidstone were supporting this day. They issued 14 fixed penalties and 28





recording speeds and passing information back to the police. The day was a great success in reminding motorists of the importance of observing speed limits and reassuring the public that road safety is a prime concern. It is hoped to repeat an allout day on a regular basis. Thank you to all our volunteers who gave of their time. WASTE DISPOSAL

The waste put in the Weekend Freighters is sent to landfill. To reduce this amount the freighter will no longer accept garden waste as this can be recycled through the garden waste collection service to your home via a special bin or the official garden sacks. From October the garden waste sacks will be compostable and made from potato starch. Residents can swap the old plastic sacks for the new type between 4th and 31st October. From 10th January 2011 only compostable sacks will be collected. Better still, have a compost heap! Large bulky

items must now be disposed of through the Bulky Waste Collection Service. The freighter next visits Staplehurst on Saturdays

PLAYSCHEME 2010

The annual scheme has been run for a number years by the Parish Council with temporary staff. This year, there was a major change as it was decided to partner with a private organisation. It was hoped to improve the scope of activities available and provide a better and more cost-effective service. The new partner, Play Place, has organised all the events and administered the scheme this year. They have brought new ideas and activities to the scheme, including a new afternoon programme for 8-12 year olds, as well the usual morning programme for 4-8 year olds. Unfortunately, the usual venue, the Primary School, became unexpectedly unavailable due to planned maintenance work inside the school buildings. We were able to secure last minute alternative accommodation thanks to the Staplehurst Guides and Scouts. The scheme

went ahead using the Guides' Centre in Jubilee Field and the Scout Hut in Nicholson Walk. The uncertainty over the venue left a lot of parents unsure about making bookings and consequently the number of participating children has dropped this year. Some reduced capacity was also necessary as the locations were smaller. Nonetheless around 40 children each day did attend the fun and games this year. The very late change of location has made it difficult to judge the success of the new partnering venture trialled this year, but the Parish Council will study all the lessons learnt and the feedback we receive from parents. We would like to thank Jensie Shepherd and her team for their hard work to ensure the children had an excellent time. We very much hope the staff team will return next year, whoever organises Playscheme 2011.

WEIGHT FOR IT

Coming soon to Staplehurst... a brand new weight management group. This free programme will be running for 10 weeks, for an hour per session, led by a nutritionist. The programme is for people who want to make a lifestyle change by altering the way they think about food & exercise. Each week will have a themed session covering different topics ranging from portion control, dealing with eating out, emotional eating,

physical activity, eating on a budget, to meal planning. There will be no calorie counting. The aim of this programme is to identify areas for change. STAPLEHURST FIRE - PARISH EMERGENCY PLAN

The recent major incident on the High Street shows the importance of the emergency services and of having procedures in place. At a public Parish meeting on 10 August in the South Hall of the Village Centre, there were presentations by Kent Fire and Rescue Services, Kent Police and the British Red Cross. Teresa Young, of KCC's Emergency Planning Department, who happens to be a Staplehurst resident, spoke about how she organised and ran the rest centre from 6am to 6pm. She outlined the new Parish Plan initiative through which this community can help itself and the emergency services in times of difficulty. A full report of this meeting is on the Parish

CHAIRMAN'S LETTER

Much has happened since the last Village Update. The fire in the village touched every resident; however, our thoughts must first go out to those who have been directly affected. As there is always something that can be learnt, we set up the public meeting on 10th August to discuss planning for possible future emergencies. Other current matters include the re-establishment of allotments and the possibility of introducing an alcohol control order to assist the police in dealing with anti-social behaviour in the parish. We recognise that rural housing remains a key issue; the Council is working with local residents to ensure that Staplehurst's views are recognised. At its

meeting on 19th July three parishioners were co-opted by vote onto the Parish Council. We welcome Jenny Fairfax, Jim Frodsham and Rory Silkin as new Councillors and thank them for volunteering their services to the community. Finally, it is with sadness that we bid farewell to Angela Knowlden and Helen Warmington. Angela has been a Councillor for a number of years and was until recently Chairman of our Amenities Committee; her experience will be very much missed. We wish her all the very best for the future. Helen was Assistant to the Parish Clerk and is leaving to take up full time study. Helen has been invaluable in her support to the Council. We wish her well with her studies.
