Proposed by Councillor Gosling, seconded by Councillor Sharp, Councillors AGREED to ACCEPT the quote of mcch Growing Concern on the terms set out in Councillor Lain-Rose's report 'Village Planters (0416)' which had been circulated prior to the meeting. They noted that the contract would be for 48 months and asked that formal annual reviews be incorporated into it. Councillors thanked Councillor Lain-Rose for his work.
- 5. Wimpey Fields Review of bids for work on new community land (PS) (for decision). Proposed by Councillor Lain-Rose, seconded by Councillor Gosling, Councillors AGREED to ACCEPT the quote of Twig Group to undertake clearance work on the terms set out in the confidential note 'Tender Responses for Wimpey Field Work' circulated prior to the meeting. Councillor Spearink reported that the representative of Medway Valley Countryside Partnership had visited the site and was comfortable with the proposed works. Councillor Spearink said there was much interest from community groups in the land to be handed over to the Parish Council. Councillor Buller thanked all those involved and Councillor Perry specifically highlighted the early efforts of Councillor Kelly.
- 6. Accounts for payment for approval. Proposed by Chairman Silkin, seconded by Councillor Lain-Rose, the list of accounts for payment was APPROVED. For the period 1st April to 6th May payments totalled £25,658.67 and receipts totalled £139,898.24.

 - Knoxbridge A229 Residents' Group / A229 Speed Limit Report of meeting with KCC 06/04/16 (BM) (Item 11, Min1530 of Full Council 03/05/16 also refers). Councillors AGREED to take this report earlier than scheduled on the agenda to accommodate the interest of members of the public who were present. Councillors NOTED: (i) they had reviewed a proposed Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) at their meeting on 3rd May and had no objection (Min1530); (ii) Councillor Manning's report dated 6th May indicated that some residents felt the proposed reduction in the speed limit at Knoxbridge to 50mph did not go far enough; (iii) residents in public forum that evening had expressed their concerns. Without amendment to their agreed position of 3rd May, they AGREED to write to KCC Highways to seek clarification of the reason why a limit of 50mph in Knoxbridge was considered more appropriate than 40mph. Councillors also NOTED that the consultation on the proposed TRO was open until 23rd May and that individuals were entitled to respond. Councillor Claridge left the meeting.
- 2. <u>Neighbourhood Plan</u> Update on Examination Status (Steering Group). Councillors NOTED that the Examiner's interim report had raised two issues relating to the potential need for a Strategic Environmental Assessment of the Neighbourhood Plan and to the methodology of site allocations. Councillors NOTED that the Steering Group had held a conference call with Feria Urbanism and planned to meet the MBC Spatial Policy team during the week commencing 23rd May to discuss a response to the Examiner.
- 3. <u>Borough Council Update</u> Councillor Perry reported that following the borough council elections the new members of committees were to be decided. He said he had been appointed Deputy Leader of the MBC Conservative Group.
- 4. <u>Accident Data Collection</u> Report on proposed operational arrangements (JR). This item was deferred in the absence of Councillor Reardon.
- 5. <u>Correspondence</u> Invitation from Staplehurst Scout Group to AGM 07/06/16. Councillors Burnham, Lain-Rose, Perry and Spearink said they would attend.

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PUBLIC FORUM: Before the meeting a resident stated his concern about speeding vehicles in High Street. A Knoxbridge resident expressed the concern felt by local residents that the proposed speed limit reduction to 50mph did not go far enough and that a 40mph limit consistent with adjoining stretches of the A229 would be more appropriate.
